what your child will be learning over the next two terms. We hope you find the newsletter useful and informative.



**Attendance** Children who come to school every day are at an advantage when it comes to making progress in their learning. They receive all the teaching they require to learn well without any gaps in their education. It is vital for all children to attend school every day of the school year, unless they are ill, have a hospital appointment or where there are other exceptional circumstances such as a family funeral.

I am sure many of you are already aware that absence for anything other than illness requires an absence request form to be collected from the school office, completed by the parent/carer, and returned to me for my attention. If the absence falls into the approved categories I will approve it as an authorised absence. I must emphasise that requests for holiday in term-time would not be authorised. You are at risk of receiving a penalty notice from the council if your child is absent without authorisation. Please support us to support your child to learn and to be the best they can be.

**Birthdays** We love celebrating the children's birthdays with them and we are aware that some children enjoy bringing cake into school to share with the class. We are also aware that some parents would prefer their children not to have sweet treats and so we ask that if you do choose to send something in please would you support parental choice by sending in individual cupcakes or packets of sweets so that class teachers can hand out easily at the end of the school day. Parent/carer consultation evenings There will be an opportunity to meet with your child's class teacher on Tuesday 17th and Wednesday 18th March 3.30-6.00pm. You will be invited to look at your child's books, discuss their learning with the teacher, receive their latest test results and ask for advice about how you can support your child at home. These appointments are important because they allow you to find out more about how your child is getting on at school so that you are well-informed, clear about how you can help, and able to praise their success.
